



# Cama Center

1880 SW Camano Drive, Camano Island WA  
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*Helpful information about renting, decorating,  
catering, set-up, parking, lodging, shuttle service,  
and more . . .*

**Cama Center offers two rental spaces**, available from noon to 10 p.m. during the peak-season and noon to 8 p.m. during the off-season. **The Great Hall** (*photo above*) is 1,857 square feet and seats 110 people. There's an outdoor dining balcony overlooking Cama Beach State Park, Puget Sound and the Olympic Mountains. The adjoining 441-square-foot **Forest Room** accommodates 40 people seated at tables. The Great Hall and Forest Room can be rented separately or together. See current prices at <https://parks.state.wa.us/391/Cama-Beach> online.

**Need more seating or some audio/visual equipment?** The Great Hall is equipped with a projector and screen, microphone and speakers, and a Blu-Ray player. You are also welcome to hire a DJ for your event. All music must be kept at a reasonable decibel level.

**Cama Center is also home of Cama Cafe**, open daily 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. for breakfast and lunch during the summer. They are open Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays the remainder of the year. When renting the Great Hall, the Cafe area and balcony is included after the restaurant service has concluded for the day. (Access to the kitchen is not included in the rental of the Great Hall.) **Need a fun place to stay for a couple of nights?** Cama Beach State Park is an historic beach resort with waterfront cabins, boat rentals, an old-fashioned store, and educational programs for families. Reservations for **the Cama Center** can be made 18 months in advance when renting seven or more cabins along with the Cama Center, or nine months in advance when renting between zero and six cabins. **Because the Cama Center is in a state park**, some events require permits to help manage celebrations outside normal day-to-day park activities. Costs and types of permits will depend on whether park staffing needs will be impacted by the event. Please contact us at (360) 387-1550 to discuss which permits might be needed and how to obtain them.

**On the day of your event**, a park concierge will greet you at the park entry Welcome Center or at Cama Center at your appointed time. Limited event parking is available at Cama Center so a park shuttle service will be provided to transport you and your guests to and from several additional upland parking lots as needed until the end of the event. The shuttle phone number is (360) 913-0250.

**When decorating for your event**, please don't remove Cama Center artwork. Put nothing into walls or wood (no staples, tacks, push-pins, etc. but command strips are ok to use on the wood or glass). Keep the bathroom hallway clear. (It's a fire exit.) Please don't touch or hang anything from the custom copper light fixtures. And please don't tape anything to the floor. Decorations can be hung from hall beams with prior approval and when renters bring their own ladder.

**After your event, leave Cama Center the way you found it.** Cleanup starts an hour before building closure at 10 p.m. (8 p.m. in the winter.) Wipe tables, chairs, and furniture with towels and water. Ask staff where to stack tables and chairs. Sweep the floors and mop up liquid spills. Put trash, recycling and composting in designated containers. Place extra trash and recycling in plastic cans outside back door. Remove all personal equipment, decorations, food, and lighting.

**Here's some additional helpful information:**

- **We recommend starting your event at 4 pm or later if you rented the Cama Center on a day where the Cama Beach Cafe is open.**
- **The couch, stuffed chairs, coffee table, and chess table** can be moved. However, they cannot be moved outside, onto the deck, into the back hall, or block the hallway.
- **The wooden tables in the buffet area** can be moved after Cama Beach Cafe closes and their patrons have left.

- **All Cama Center furniture must stay in the building. This includes event tables and chairs.**
- **Decorations can be hung** from ceiling beams if approved ahead of time.
- **Wax candles are only allowed to be burned as part of a ceremony and with customer proof of additional insurance.** We recommend battery-powered candles for decoration.
- **Due to liability risks, we cannot loan ladders** but you are welcome to bring your own.
- **Serving alcohol requires a Washington State [Banquet Permit](#),** approved by a Park Ranger. Event organizers are responsible for ensuring no minors have access to alcohol and that no one is intoxicated. A professional bartender or responsible adult must be assigned to oversee the dispersal of the alcohol. State law prohibits intoxication in State Parks. Beer kegs require permission of the Park Manager, a banquet permit, and a catering and bartending contract with the Cama Beach Cafe.
- **State law allows consumption of alcohol in cabins, campsites, picnic areas and buildings,** but not on park roads or beach.
- **Cama Beach Cafe and Catering** operates at Cama Center and can be reached at [catering@camabeachcafe.com](mailto:catering@camabeachcafe.com). Contracting with another caterer? Make sure they know they will need to be self-contained without access to a kitchen or water/electrical hookups.
- **One or more barbecues can be placed on the sidewalk** at least 25 feet from Cama Center. If the barbecue is on a trailer, it can be parked in the pull-out area by the sidewalk but not in front of the wheelchair ramp. Barbecues cannot be placed in front of the entry doors or on the deck.
- **Cama Beach State Park also offers outdoor ceremony and reception locations on the beach.** Canopies and ceremonial arches are allowed as long as stakes are not used and the ground is not disturbed. Weighted containers can be used to secure event canopies or arches. Nothing may pierce the ground at Cama Beach.
- **Guests attending an event at Cama Center need a Discover Pass,** available at Cama Beach Welcome Center. However, registered guests staying in a cabin do not need one. They receive one overnight pass as part of their cabin rental. Additional vehicles staying overnight will need to purchase an extra vehicle overnight pass. There are several ways we can work with you to avoid guests having to pay for a Discover Pass as they arrive. One way is for event hosts to prepay their guests' day passes. Certain exemptions apply: (1) HDCP placard, DP plates, or WA State Disability card, (2) WA State Disabled Veteran card or DV plates, (3) WA State Senior Citizen Limited Income Pass, (4) WA State Foster Family Pass.
- **All fireworks are prohibited in Washington State Parks.**
